Performance last Wednesday

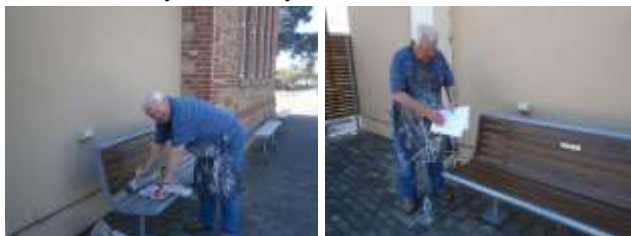

Dealing with an angry child

Children need to learn to be respectful. And while it's normal for children to push boundaries, it is just as important for parents to be clear on where those boundaries lie.

Your child knows what is right and wrong. But in the heat of the moment, emotions are high. Being angry feels powerful. It gets a reaction. And some children learn, fast, that it gets them what they want. When your child is being disrespectful to you, it's your job to teach them to be respectful.

Teaching your child calming, coping strategies can be helpful.

Coping strategies

When your child is getting angry:

- Ask them to identify the rating of their anger out of 10. This helps identify the feeling, and helps recognise that the strong feelings decrease over time
- Relax. Deep breathing helps some children be calm
- Visualisation. Tell your child to imagine sitting near a river. They're watching the river flow in front of them. A leaf flows by. It slowly floats past them and disappears around the corner. Teach your child that their thoughts float in and float out away like a leaf

When your child is angry, they can believe everything they think. Help them to understand that thoughts are just thoughts. They're not facts. Sometimes our thoughts are wrong.

Watch language. If your child can say "I feel upset. I need to take some deep breaths", they'll have a more resilient mindset and better coping strategies.

What you do matters too

Here are a few things that you can do to improve the situation:

- Don't react
- Be clear on boundaries
- Offer comfort
- Set a good example

If you remain calm you remain smart

Numeracy

Last fortnight's puzzle:

Two fathers and two sons go fishing. Each of them catches one fish. So why do they bring home only three fish?

Because only three people went fishing. The fishing group is made up of a grandfather, his son

and his son's son. The person of middle age is both a father to the youngest person and a son to the oldest person. Thus, we have two fathers and two sons even though there are only three people. It may help to draw a picture to make it clearer.

Work out the following:

$$111,111,111 \times 111, 111, 111 =$$

Check using a calculator.

The answer is: 12, 345, 678, 987, 654, 321.

Pretty amazing!
