Social Media

There are many reasons why it is recommended that primary school students should be given limited access to social media.

Social media can be addictive

Social media can be extremely addictive, which can harm your children's' academic performance, social skills, and overall well-being. Children may spend too much time online, neglect other important activities such as completing homework, playing outside, participating in sport or extracurricular activities, reading, or spending time with family and friends.

Inappropriate exposure and bullying

Social media platforms can expose children to inappropriate content, cyberbullying, and dangerous interactions with strangers. Children may not be familiar with how to handle these situations, which can lead to your child becoming confused, anxious and even following negative behaviours that they have been exposed to, or led to believe are acceptable.

Self Esteem and Social Groups

Excessive use of social media can negatively impact children's self-esteem and body image. Children may compare themselves to others online, which can lead to feelings of inadequacy and a distorted self-image. Children may also find themselves in situations where their friends or classmates are left out of chats or groups, leading to issues when they come to school the following day

Summary

While social media can have some benefits for children, such as staying connected with family and friends and accessing educational resources, it's important to limit your child's access and monitor their usage to ensure they are benefiting from the use of social media and not experiencing some of the potential negative effects.

Ava


Mulga might crash his bicycle and someone might come and help him. Bella D I predict that he will crash at the end and then sing a poem.


Joshua
